

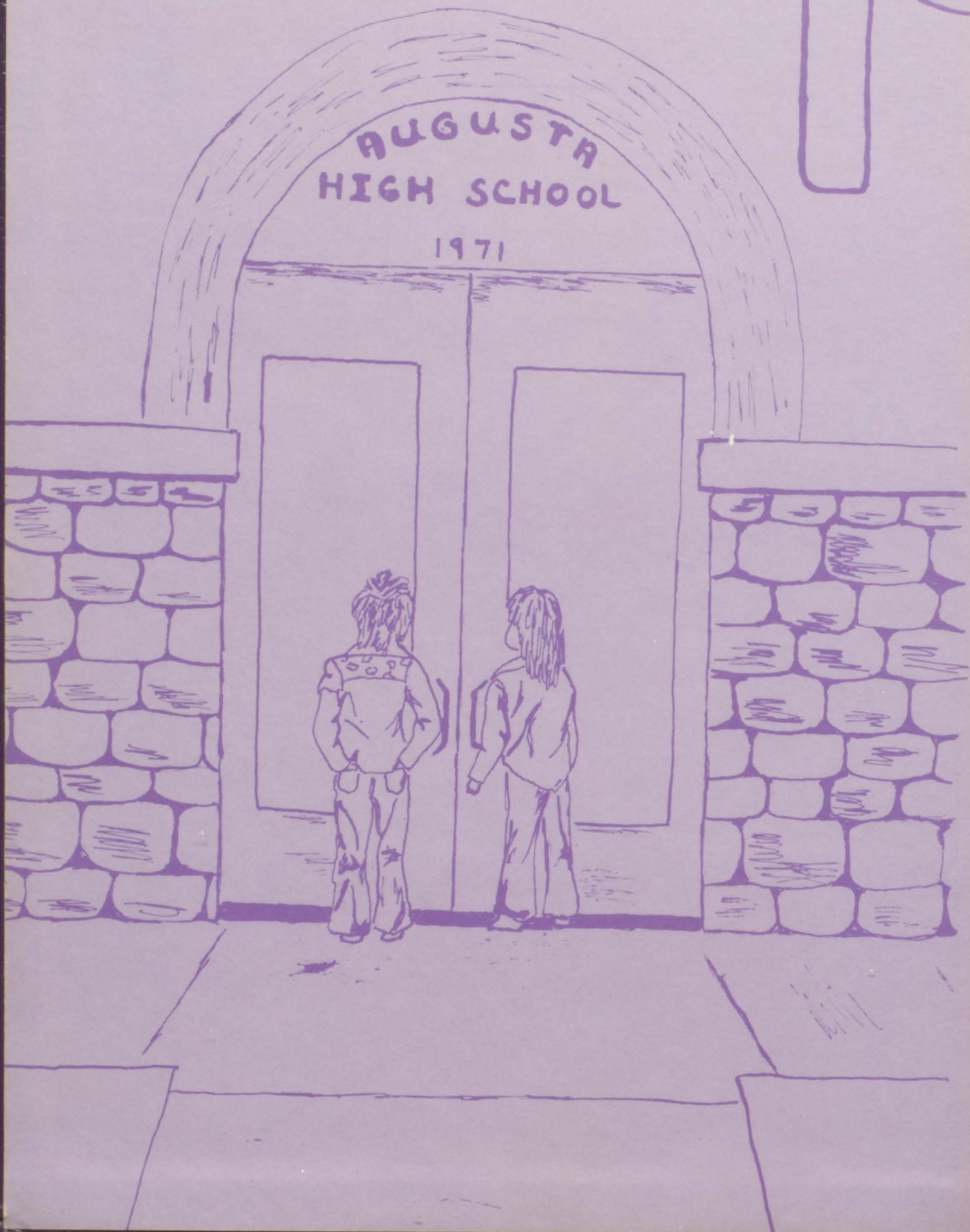

And so we gratefully acknowledge all of their sacrifices and hope that we may one day live up to their expectations.

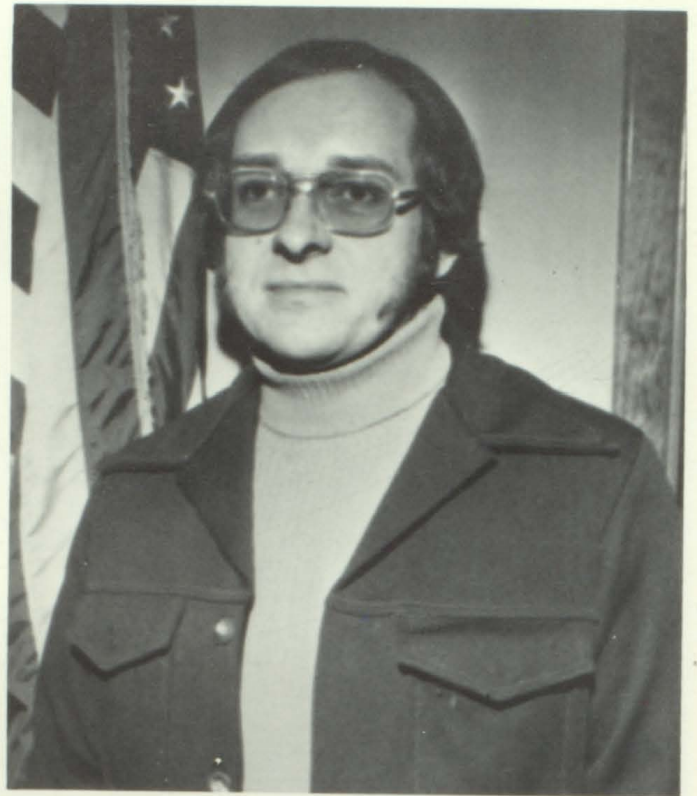

Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Silvernail teach the more advanced classes, such as American Literature, Shakespeare and Non-Fiction Reading.





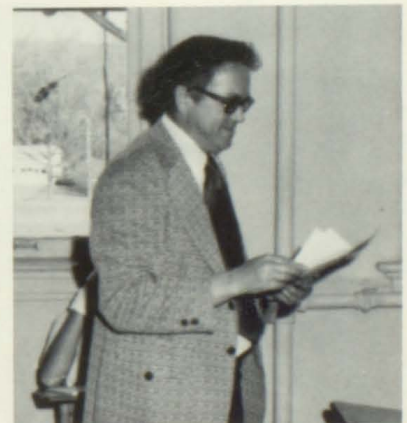
Mrs. Gloria Hunter teaches seventh grade Language Arts where the students learn Basic English Skills.

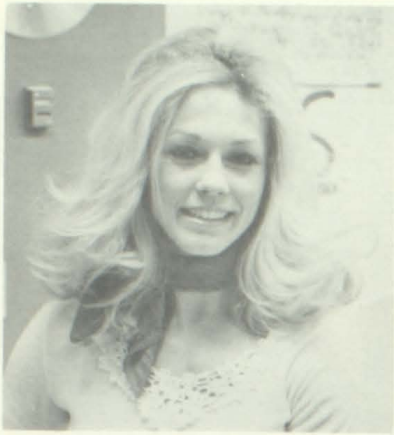
Mrs. Elsie Smiley teaches advanced Algebra to Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors. She also teaches eighth grade math and consumers math.

Mr. Merlin Kardin teaches his students the science of chemistry. He also teaches eighth grade earth science.

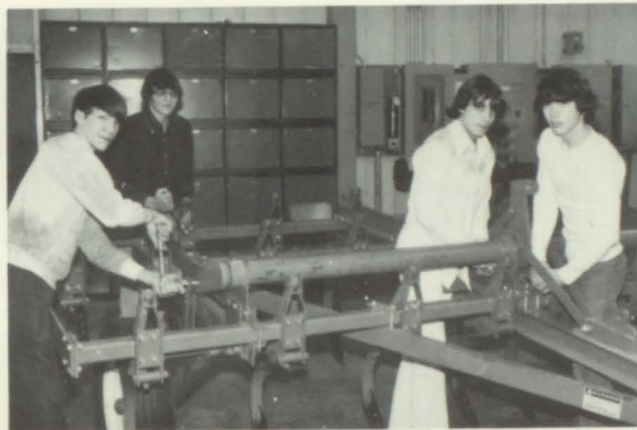
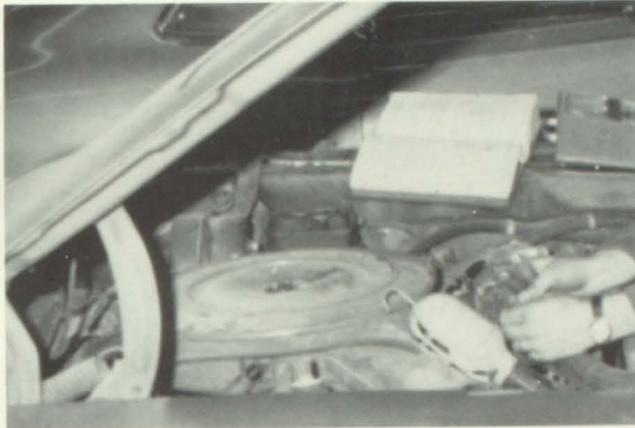
Mrs. Jill Rybak teaches the art of home economics. She also teaches child development and family relations.

Mr. David Gavin teaches his agriculture class the best way of operating a farm successfully.

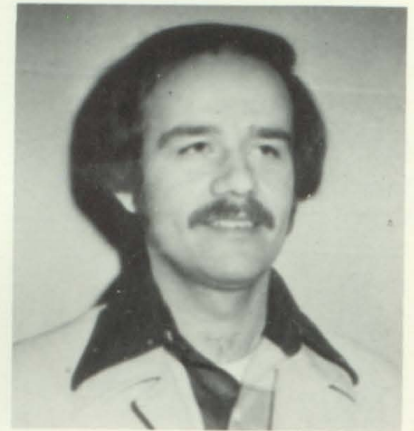
Mr. David Rybak who is located in the vocational building teaches the industrial arts class.





Mr. Gary Thorsen helps his art students use their talents to create their own masterpieces.

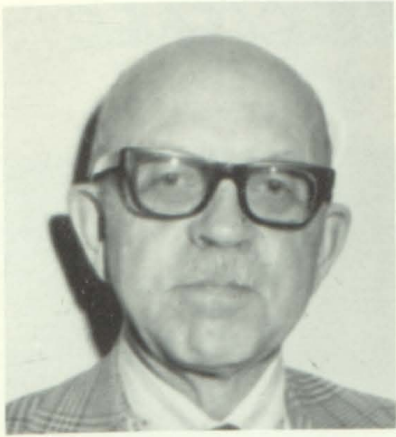
Mr. Donald Young teaches his students instrumental music. He also gives individual lessons.



Miss Cheryl Ellis teaches vocal music three days a week. She also does substituting for the teachers.

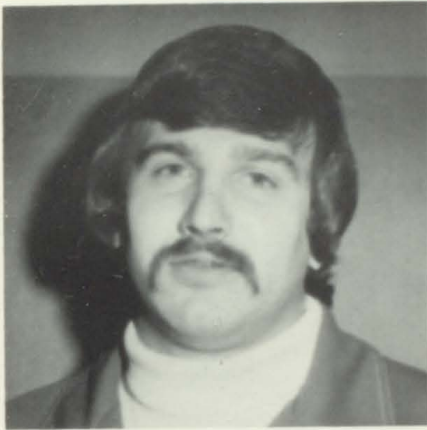
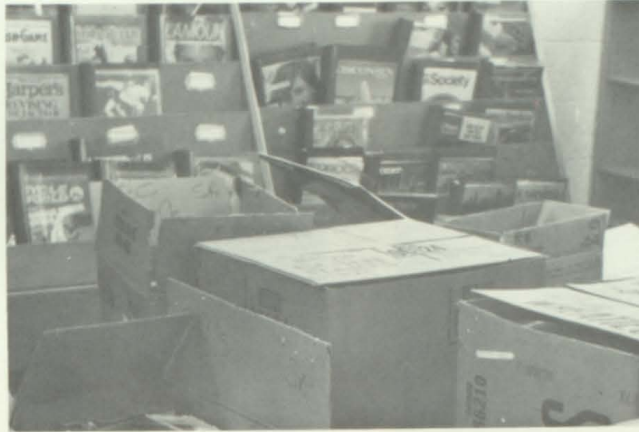
Mrs. Larea Diehl teaches girls phys-ed and health. Mr. James Osborn teaches boys phys-ed.

It is possible to build up enough points to earn a letter by attending meetings and activities. The advisor is Mrs. Diehl.

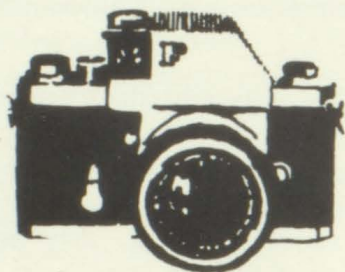

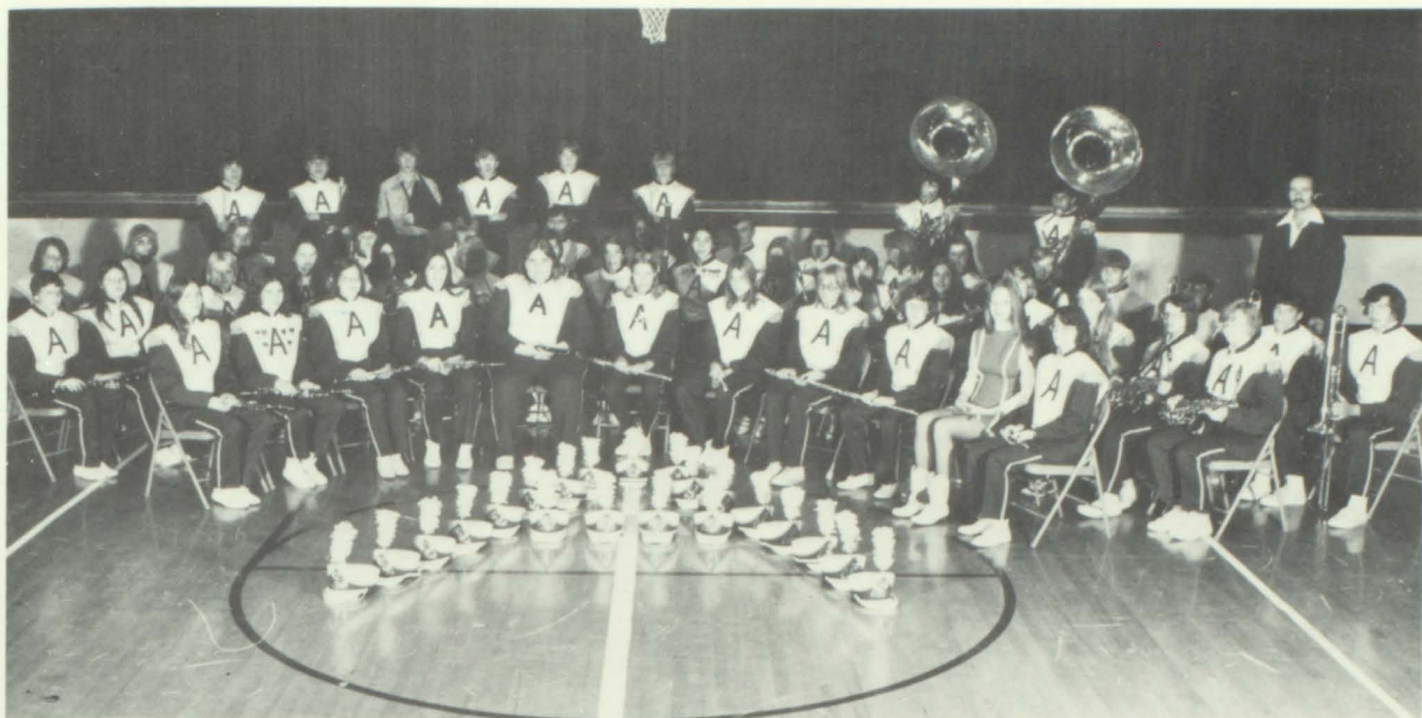
