



The best times you'll remember though are always with a friend whom you've known since kindergarten as loyal to the end.


Shared laughs, dreams and promises throughout the teen-age years have built a base of trust and love; a support to fight life's fears.

A scrapbook is meant for memories pictures that will find the carefree, crazy high school scene living in your mind.



Though these three people live away from us, they still have our SENIOR STYLE!!!




# High School Dances to the Tunes...

## "What's New in '82"












