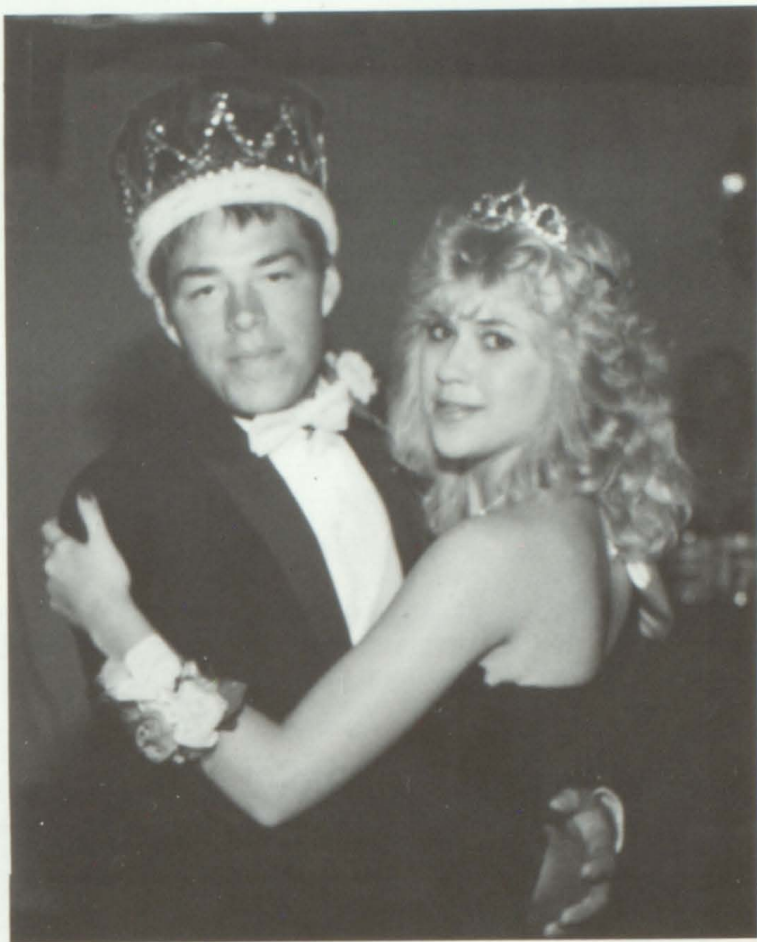


H o m e c o m i n g '8 7 H e r e I G o A g a i n

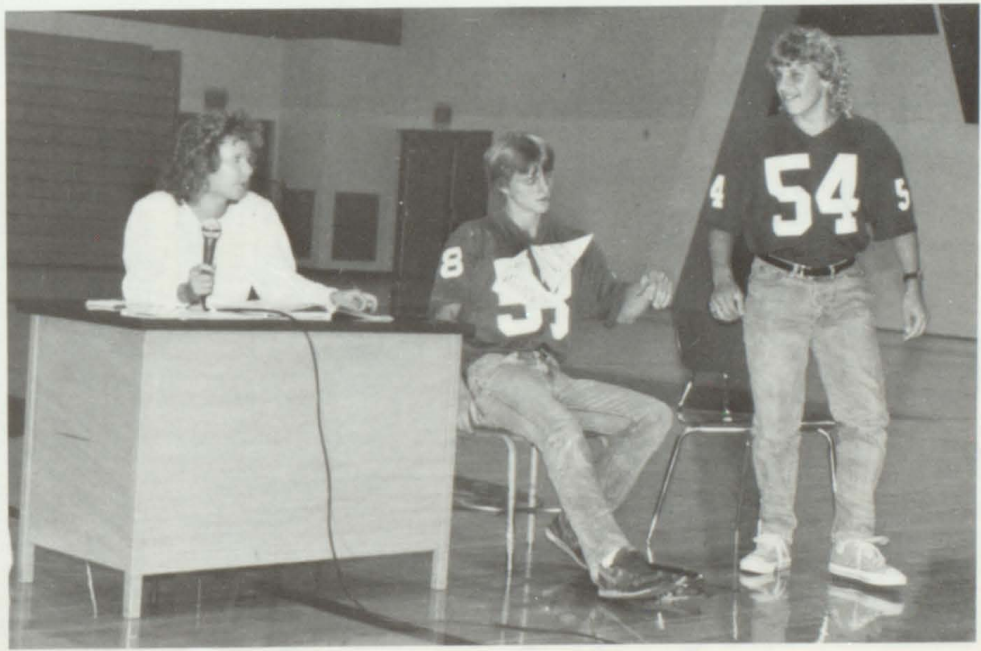
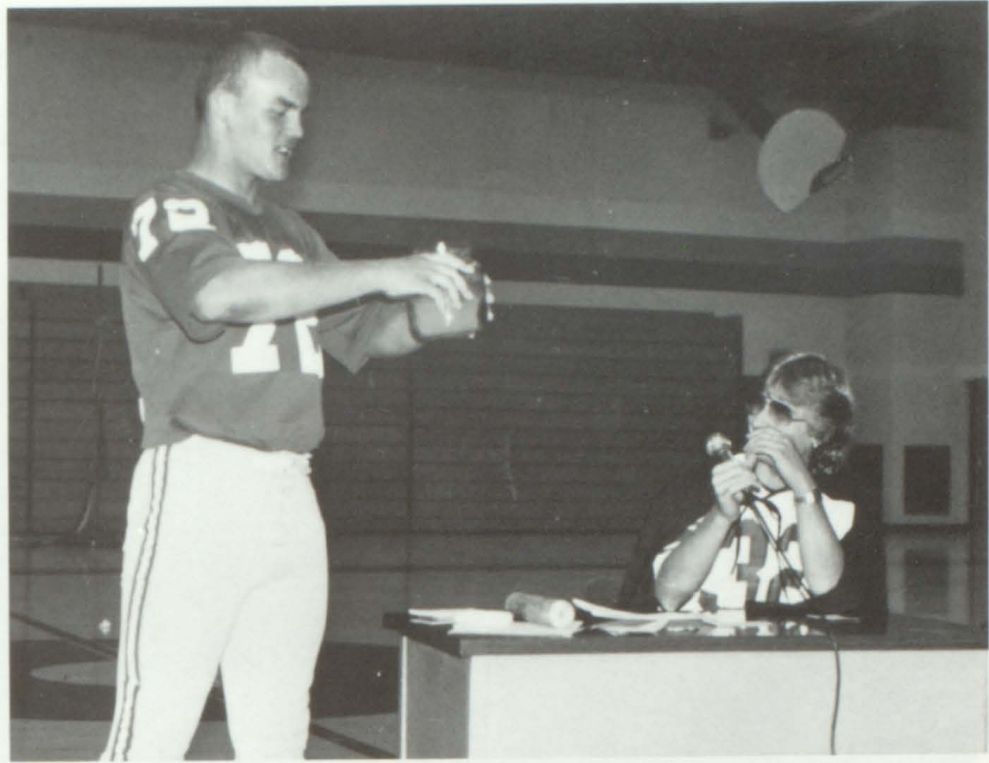


DRESS UP DAYS
