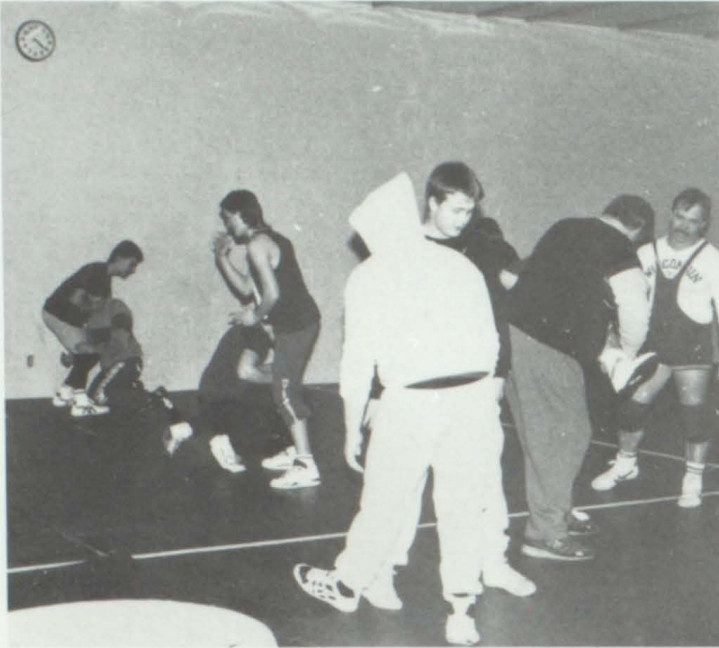

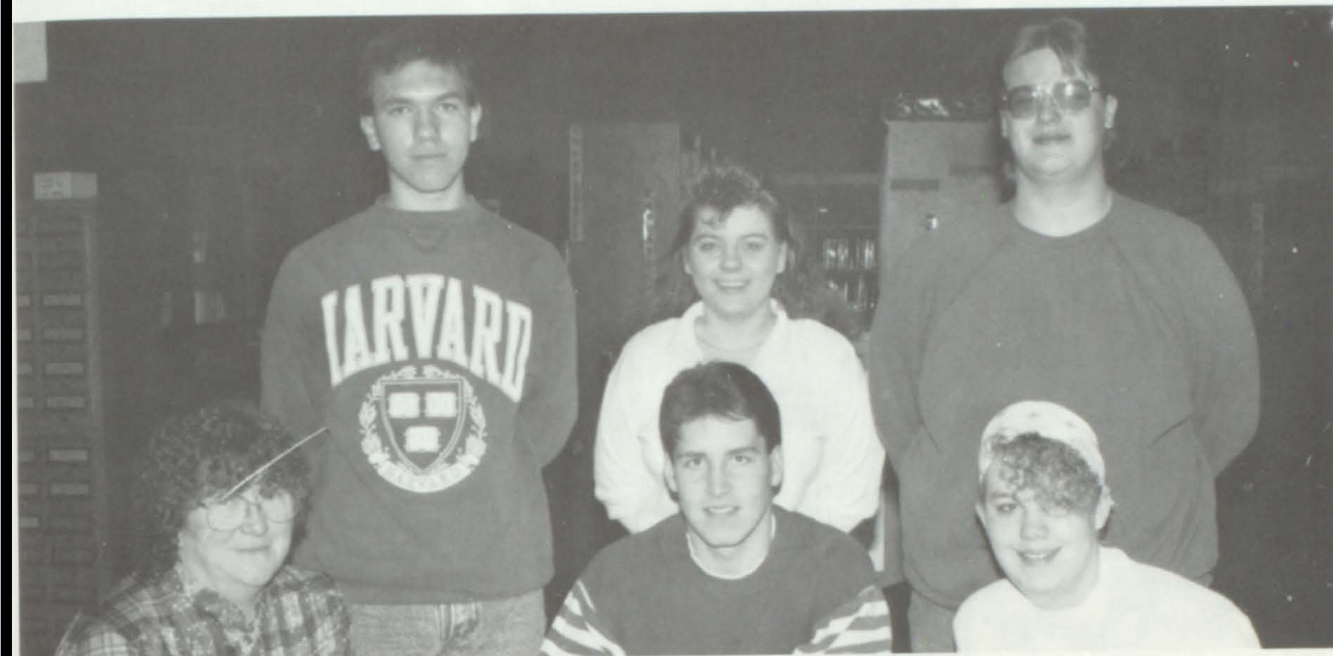
Academic Decathlon and Mock Trial
