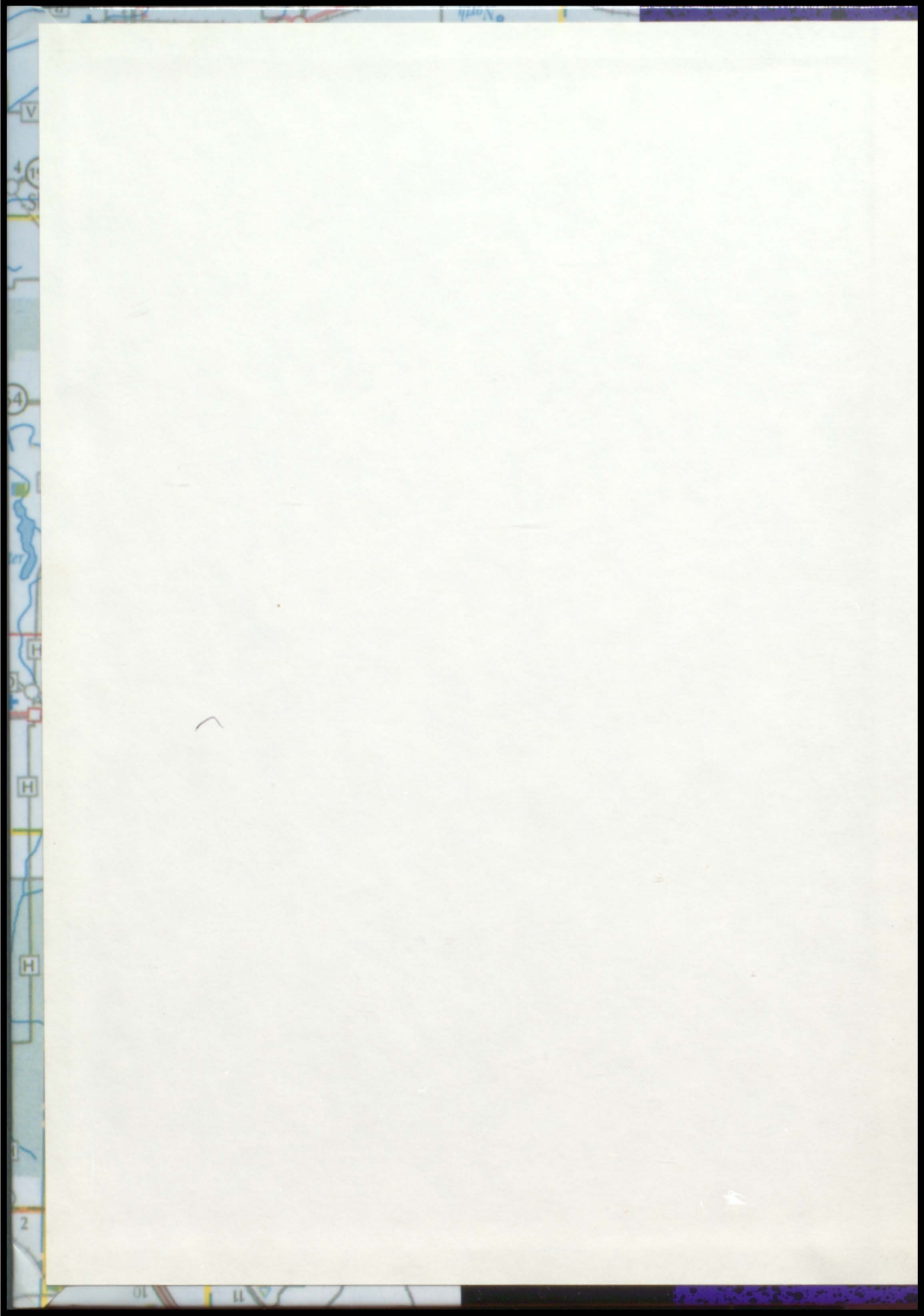

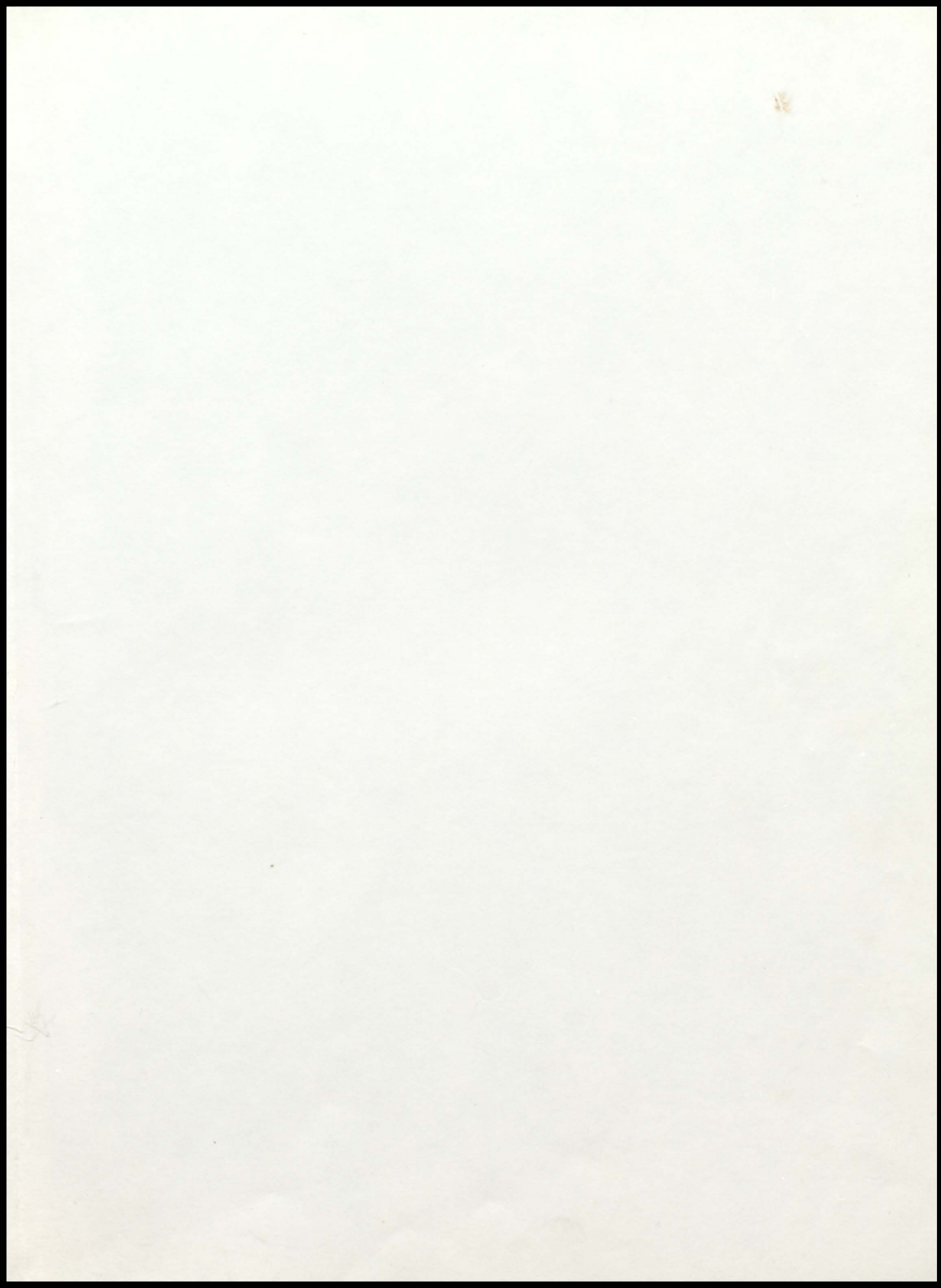

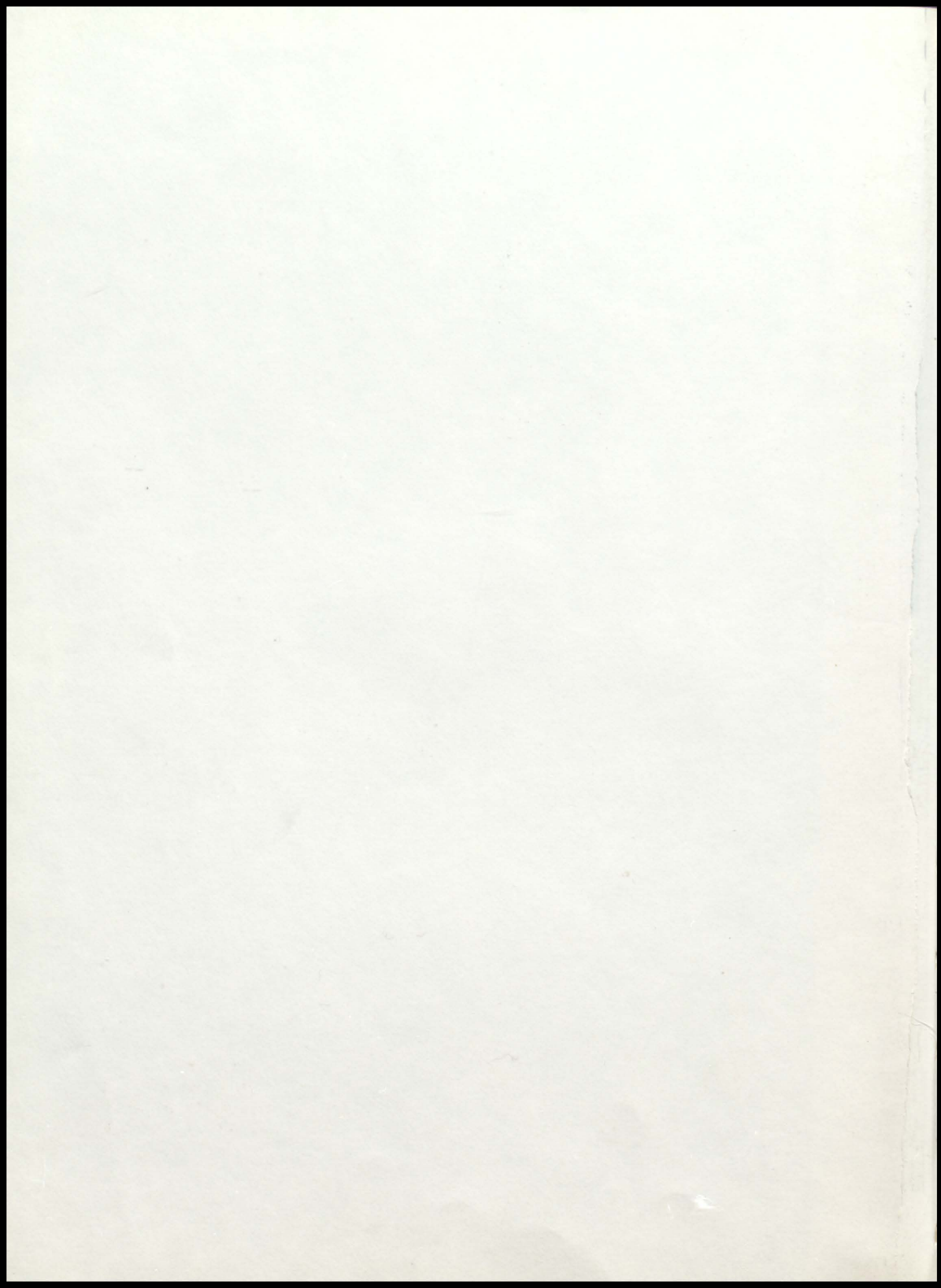

# DEDICATION



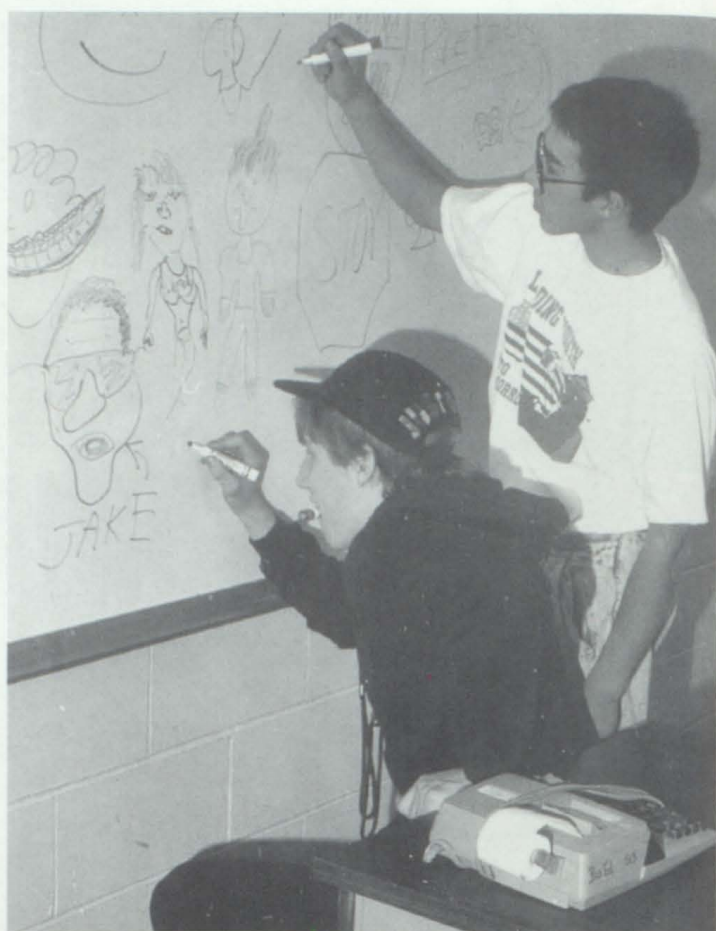

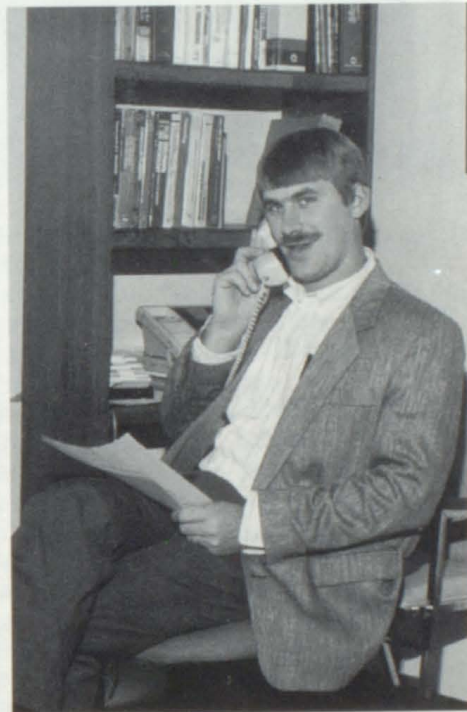

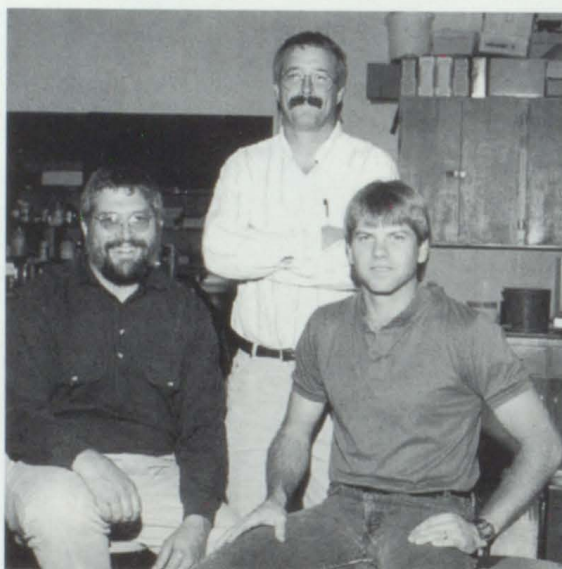

# Directing Traffic

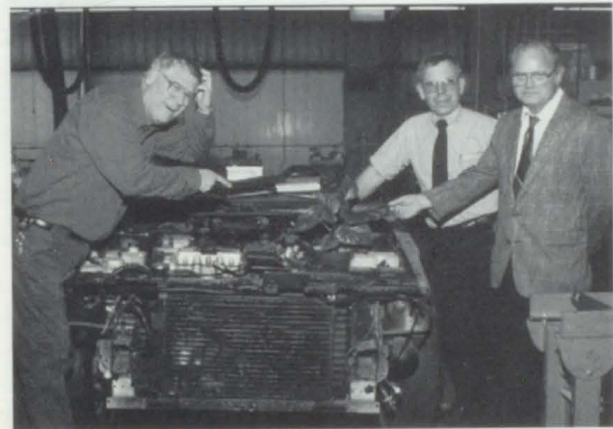

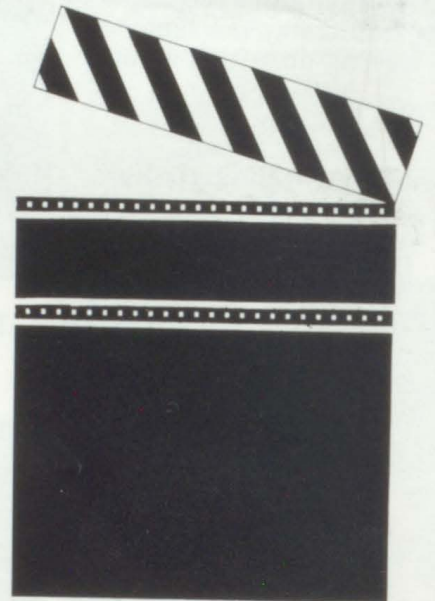




# The On-Beaten Path

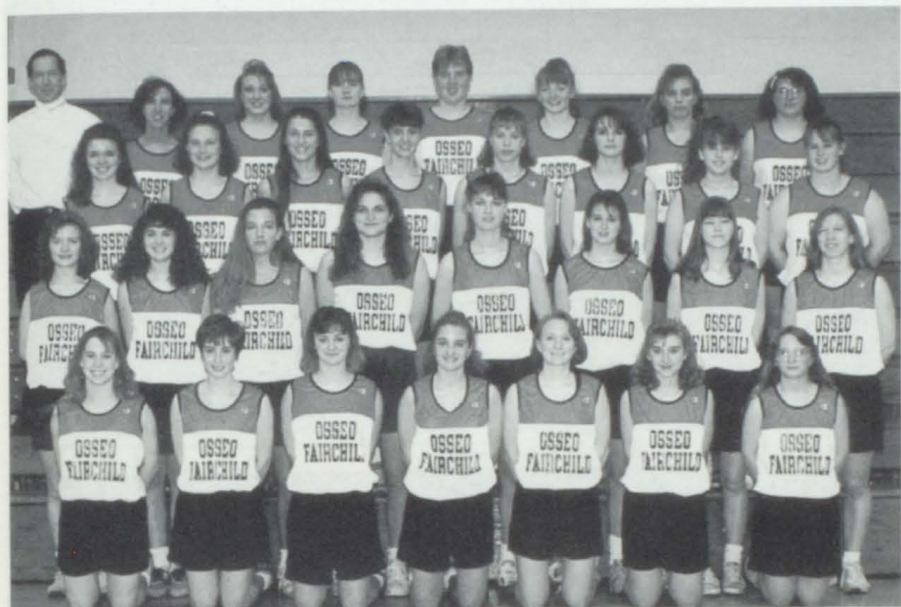
