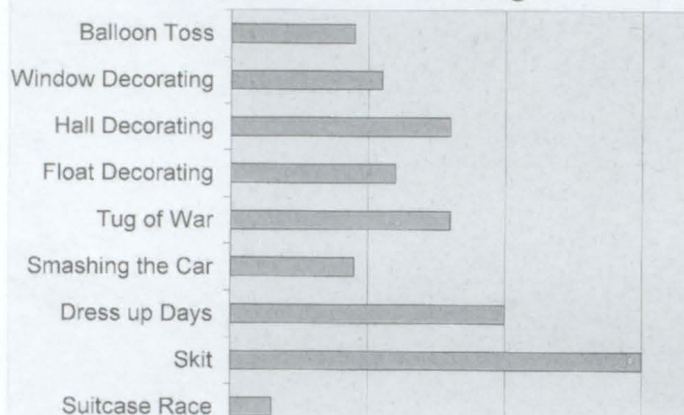
# We Got Spirit!

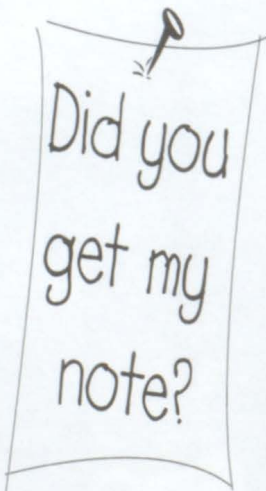

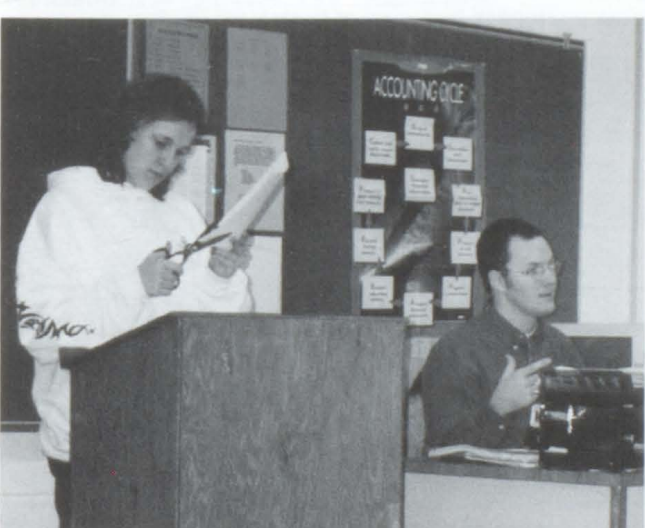

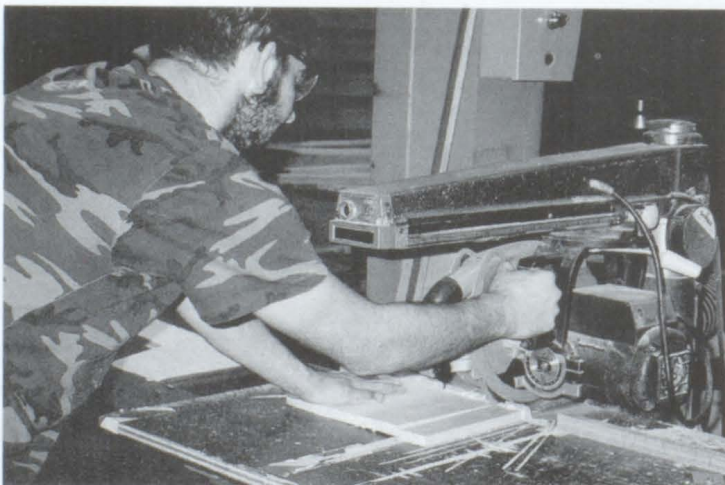

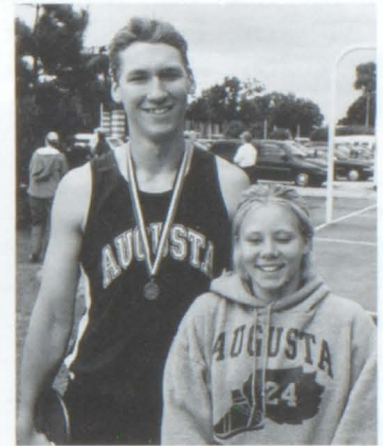

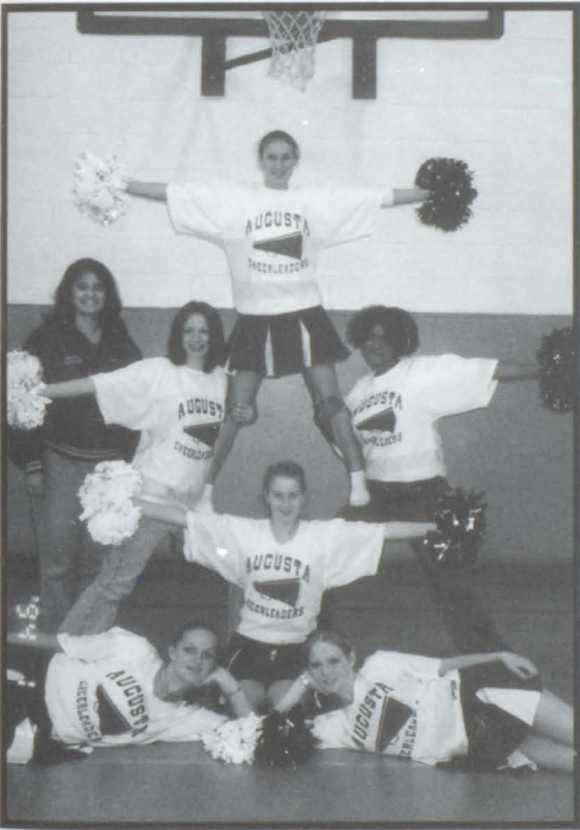
# Let Me See Your Cheerleaders!

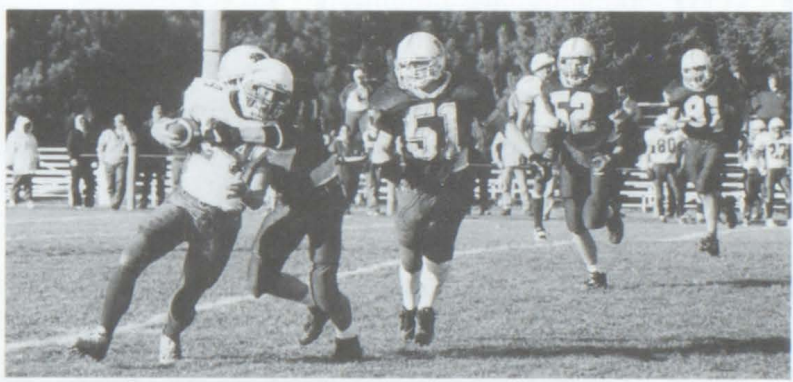

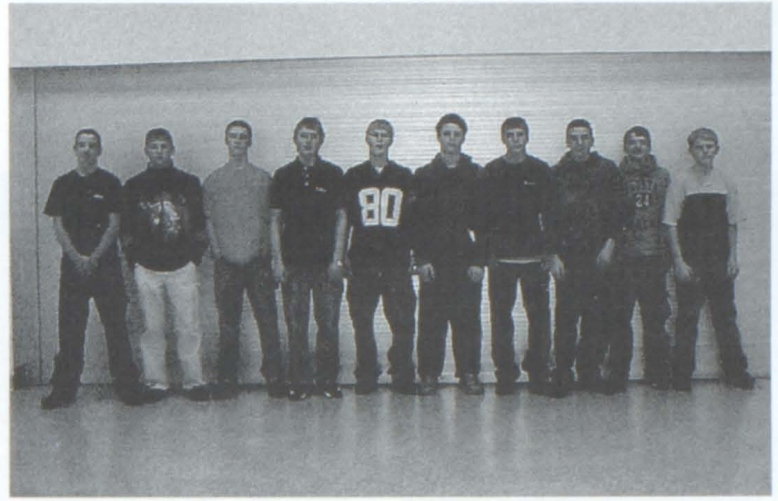

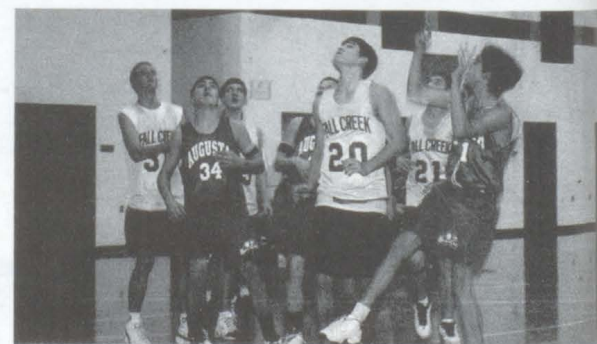

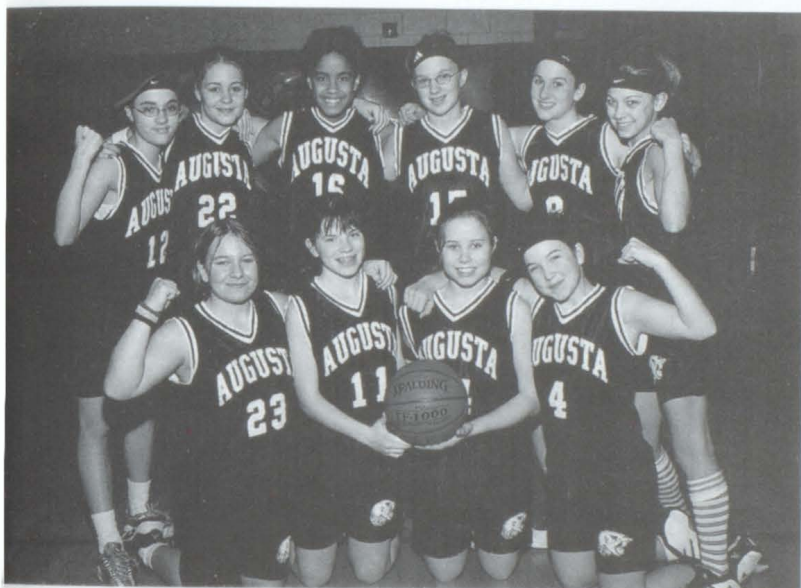

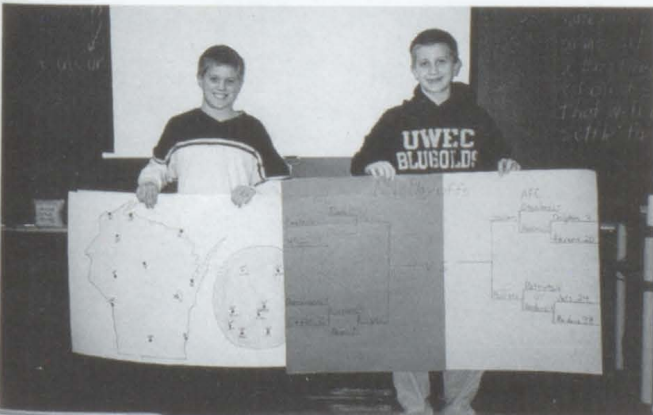
